### **GET THE SCOOP BEFORE YOU DIG**



Starting an outdoor project soon? Reach for the phone before the shovel. Call 811 to have underground utilities located at least two days in advance of digging, even before planting flowers.

One call dispatches every local utility to your location who then identifies each buried line with colorcoded, water-soluble paint.

The service is free, and could help avoid the potentially costly and dangerous consequences of striking buried utility lines. Some utilities can be buried only a few inches deep, and property owners are responsible for damage. Call 811 before you dig it's the law.

### **CLARK PUBLIC UTILITIES RACE FOR WARMTH RAISES RECORD FUNDS**





The Race for Warmth is produced and hosted by Clark Public Utilities with support from local businesses, including Area Heating & Cooling, Burgerville, Prairie Electric, Asplundh, New Tradition Homes, and many more. Their generous contributions helped run this year's Race for Warmth over a record-breaking fundraising finish line for Operation Warm Heart.

A record 1,750 runners, walkers and riders braved a chilly January morning to hit the pavement and, with the support of local business partners, raised more than \$80,000 for Clark Public Utilities' Operation Warm Heart. Funds raised this year will help nearly 300 households experiencing financial crisis with heating expenses.

## **Fuel Mix**



We have a diversified power supply to meet your needs. Clark Public Utilities procures electricity from a variety of resources. Under the fuel mix disclosure law, RCW 19.29A, Washington utilities are required to report the sources of power used to serve customers, as collected by the Department of Commerce annually. The most recent published data is for the year 2023:

Biogas	0.11%	Nuclear	5.75%
Biomass	.0.40%	Solar	2.36%
Hydro	40.06%	Wind	.10.71%
Natural Gas 3	31.77%	Market*	8.84%

\* "Market" is a mix of wholesale market purchases from unspecified generation sources.
